DEVELOPING TRADITIONS

We honour our commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, incorporating Māori tikanga - traditions and protocols - appropriately throughout school life.

Our unique school traditions form an important part of our culture and help us all develop a sense of connection and belonging. On your first day at Westlake, you will proceed with all the new students through our archway, symbolising the start of your journey as a Westlake boy. You will not walk through the arch again until your last day at Westlake, when you become a 'Westlaker' and enter the world beyond school.

You will be placed in one of our six houses – Hood, Murchison, Pupuke, Smale, Stanley or Ururoto – and will be a member of that house for your whole time at Westlake. The house system encourages healthy competition while helping you develop a sense of pride and belonging in your school. Houses compete throughout the year in different activities for house points, which are tallied at the end of the year to determine the winners of the House Cup. One of the first inter-house activities of the year is the highly-anticipated House Haka Competition, which ends with a rousing whole school Haka.

LEARNING AT WESTLAKE BOYS



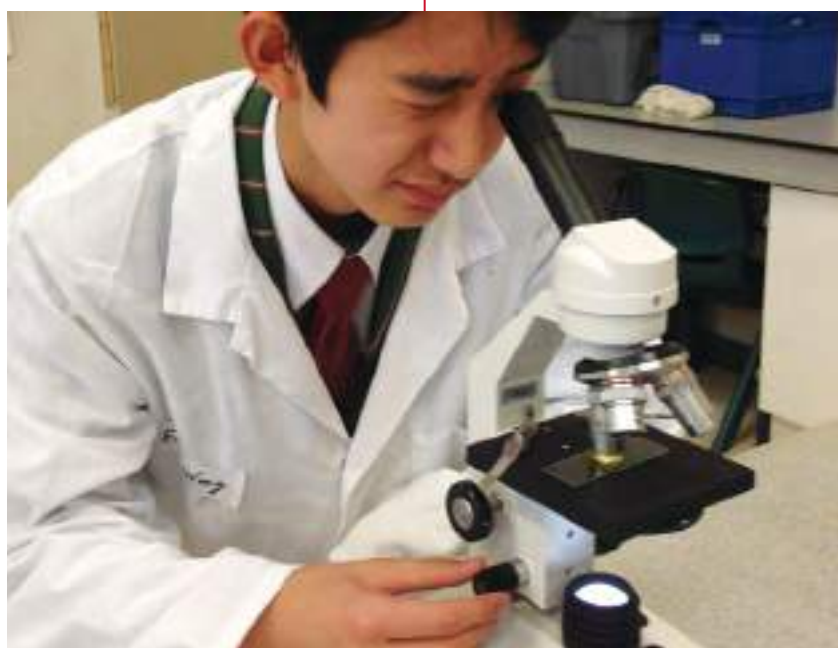
We want you to enjoy your learning because we know that you will do better when you enjoy your work. Your teachers will make your lessons interesting and relevant and they will get to know you well, to understand how you learn best. You will be encouraged to think independently, to guide your own learning and to be courageous; challenging yourself to explore and be creative. We hope that you will leave Westlake with the curiosity of a life-long learner.

In Years 9 and 10, you will be offered a wide range of subjects to choose from. You will study english, science, mathematics, social studies and at least one language, as well as having lessons in the arts, technology and physical education. In Years 11, 12 and 13, we will guide you to select subjects that are suited to your interests and strengths and which help you on a path towards future study and careers options.



If you need extra support with your learning, we have an excellent Learner Support Department who will work alongside you and help you set and achieve goals. If you have a particular strength in any area, we will extend you and challenge you through our extension pathways. Our excellent ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) teachers will support you and increase your confidence if you need extra help with your English language skills.

If your passion is performing drama and theatre, or developing and executing technical production skills, you will have the opportunity to be involved with our annual school production, either performing on stage or as part of the back-stage crew. The Westlake Schools' productions, in conjunction with Westlake Girls, are innovative, exciting and thought-provoking and have won numerous regional and national awards in recent years. These productions regularly involve more than 100 students from all years and backgrounds.



CELEBRATING OUR CULTURES



We take pride in being a truly bicultural school in a multi-cultural environment and we celebrate the many cultures and traditions our students bring to Westlake Boys. We are the only school on the North Shore to offer Maori Performing Arts as a curriculum subject and our Kapa Haka and Pasifika groups are very active, taking part in Polyfest and regularly performing at school and community events.

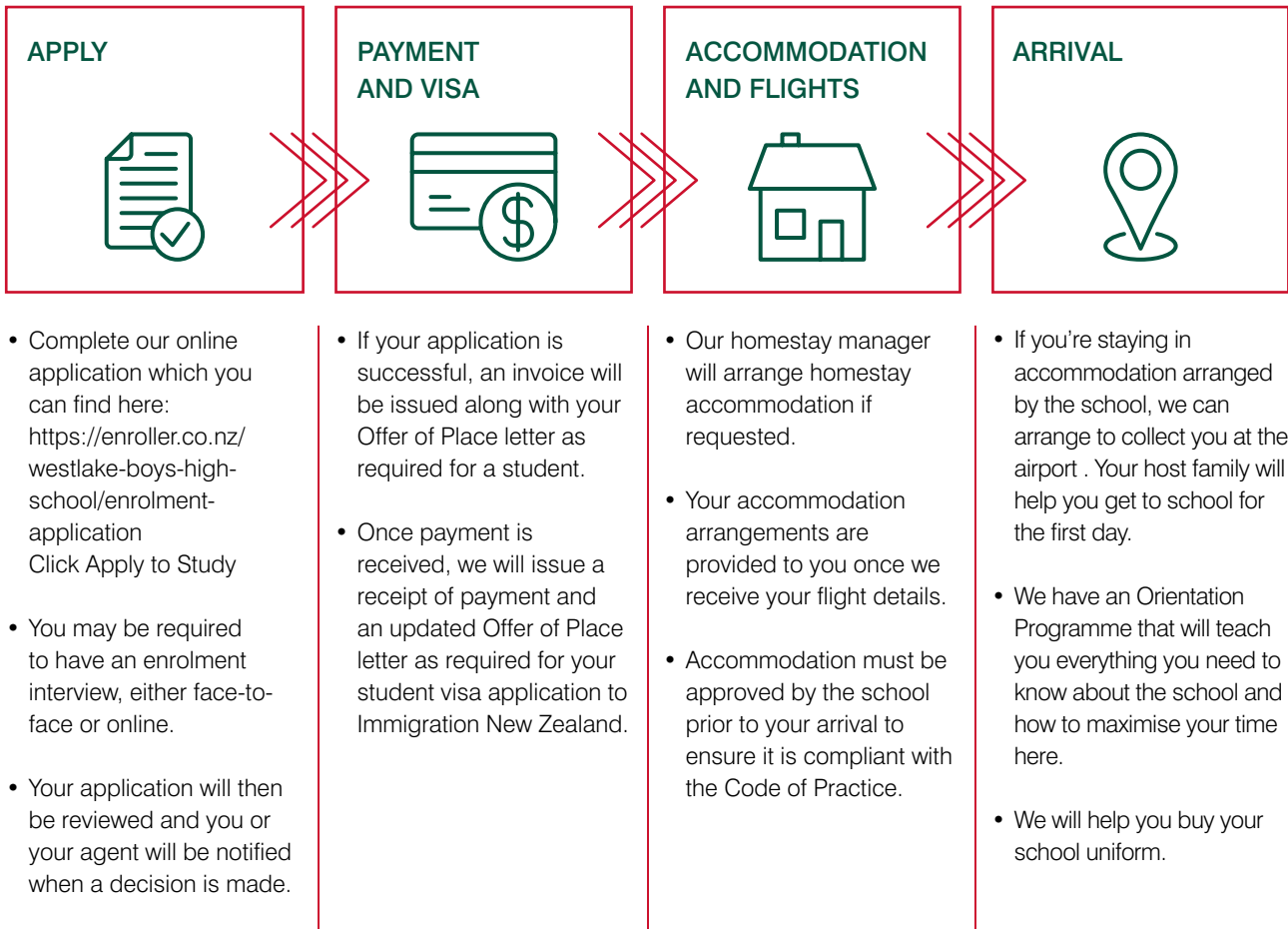
At Westlake, I learned that in tough times, we don't give up. We persevere to overcome difficulties and find solutions to the hardships we face in our lives.
